

Charlee Bear Dog Treats Recall

November 1, 2012 – Charlee Bear Products is **voluntarily recalling** certain lots of its Protein Crunch Bar products because they may be contaminated with **Salmonella**.



The event was reported by the company in a [news release dated November 1, 2012](#). According to the company, there have been no reported animal or human illnesses related to these products.

The Protein Crunch Bar dog treats were **distributed nationally** in September and October 2012.

What Products Are Being Recalled?

According to the company's news release...

The potential for contamination was noted after a finished product sample of Protein Crunch Bars Chicken Recipe with Carrots (Lot no. 19812) tested positive for the presence of Salmonella.

Charlee Bear is recalling that lot number and, out of an abundance of caution, the additional lot numbers identified above, all of which are manufactured by a contract manufacturer that is not otherwise involved in the production of any other products in the Charlee Bear line.

What to Do?

Consumers are urged to **return** the recalled product to the place of purchase for a **full refund**.
